Cell Phones:

At LAC, cell phone service is not always guaranteed. As a courtesy to other participants, please turn your cell phone to vibrate during activities. When necessary to take a call, if another chaperone is available to supervise the participants, please feel free to step away from the group as to not disturb the programming.

Facilities:

Life Adventure Center is located on over 575 acres in Woodford County. Please stay with your group and only in designated areas. Do not enter any fields with out a LAC staff member present.

Participant Supervision:

The staff at Life Adventure Center will provide quality programming to your group. Please encourage the participants to stay engaged in the activities. Group Leaders and Chaperones are responsible for the discipline of participants, especially during meals and if any free time is scheduled.

Weather:

Programs at LAC go on rain or shine year round. Please dress in layers and appropriately for the weather. Bring rain gear and encourage participants to wear rain gear when needed.

Meals:

LAC does not provide food or beverage. Please check with your group coordinator to discuss meal options. To keep LAC beautiful, please put all trash in designated containers. Please empty all recyclables before placing them in the recycling containers.

First Aid:

Life Adventure Center staff is trained in C.P.R. and First Aid. Please notify LAC staff if medical attention is needed. In order to prevent similar incidents in the future, it is necessary to keep a record of all injuries.

Vehicles:

Because our property is home to horses, cattle, dogs, staff, campers, and wildlife, chaperones are asked to observe all speed limit signs (15 mph). Animals and participants always have right of way. Please use the Challenge Course entrance (second entrance) and proceed down the gravel road until you reach the pavilion (about 1 mile). Please park in the gravel parking lot.

Due to the nature of our camp we request that all participants and guests observe our smoke, drug, alcohol, and weapon free property.

We also request that they do not bring their personal pets onto the property.
